In RE we start our Christmas topic and learn about Jesus' birth and about the visitors they received.

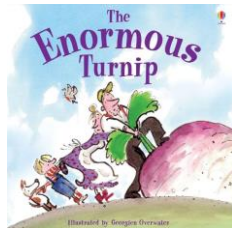
Don't forget to scan the QR codes each day to practise phonics with your child at home.

nibble, munch.

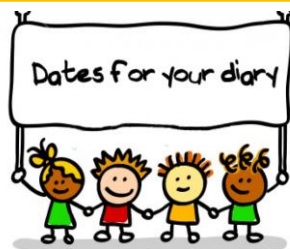
Story Time
