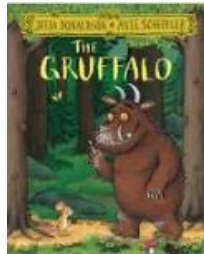
In RE we have completed our topic of Easter. We will be thinking about the new topic of Pentecost.

Talk about the words and what they mean. Can you use these words within a sentence throughout the week?

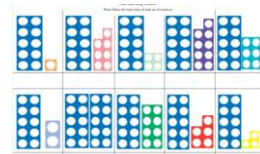
Focus Story:

Story Time

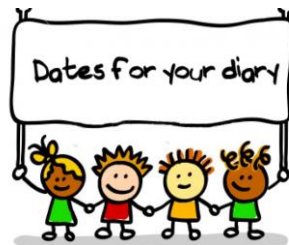
Reading books will be changed throughout the week.

- Sort animals into their habitats and begin to think about their similarities and differences
- Create a habitat for insects outside on a large scale and add to it each week
- Play in our new role play area - investigating minibeasts!
- Making lifecycles about ducklings, chicks, caterpillars
- Be confident counting forwards and backwards to 20
- Starting to learn our doubles for numbers to 10.
- Know how to make teens numbers in different ways.
- Know about different types of habitat
- Explore our curiosity cube
- Writing labels, lists and information linked to our new topic
- Using our Gruffalo tuff tray to tell the story in their own words
